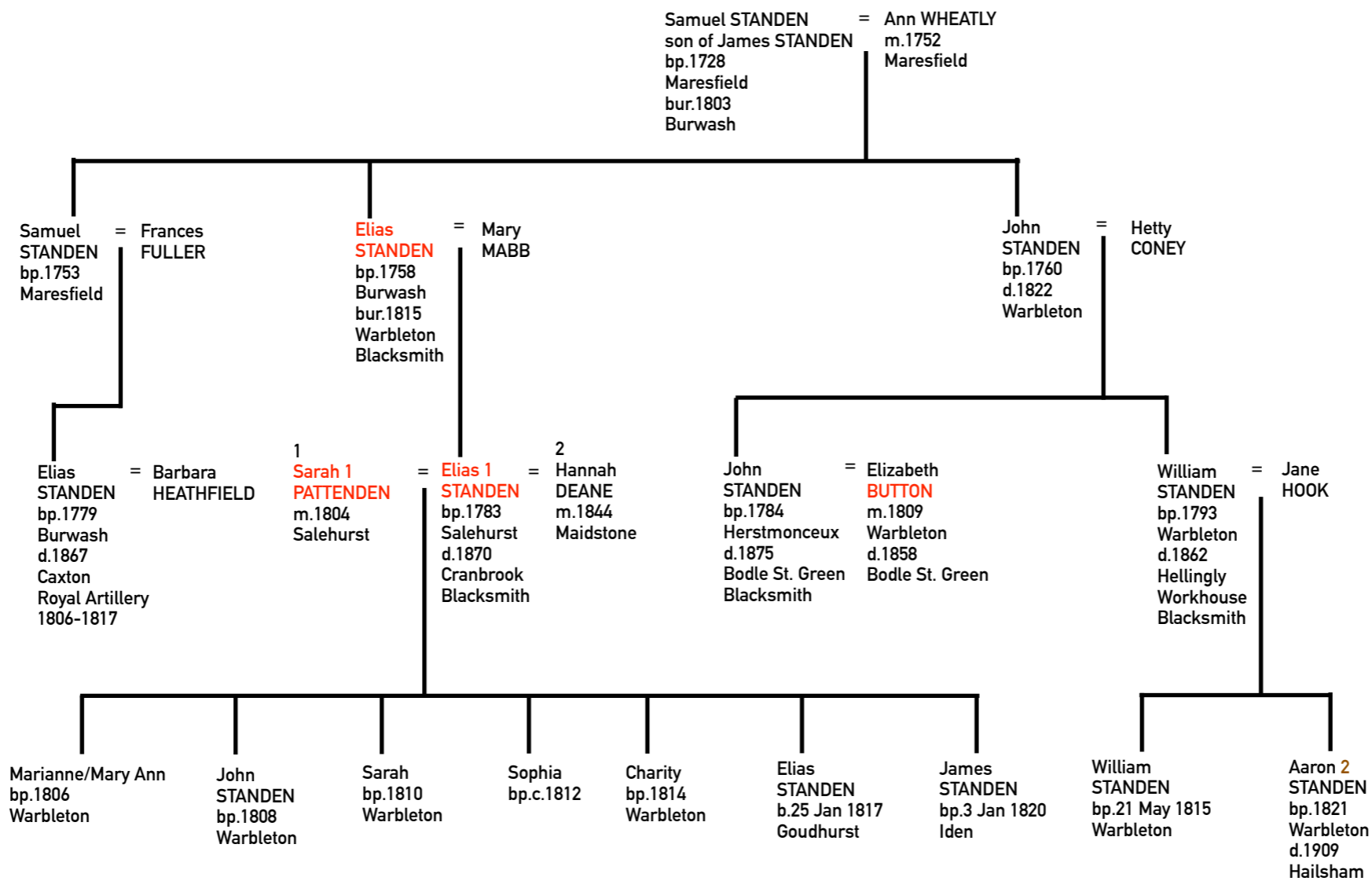

NOTES for the STANDEN Pedigree Page 2 of 4

1 Removal record (with a respite delay) for Elias and his family 12 Jan 1816, from Warbleton to Goudhurst.
The birth of their son Elias, Jan 1817, in Goudhurst, confirms the migration to Kent as before 11th July 1817 (Henry, M. 2024, p.257).
The last mention in the diary of 'Master Standen's blacksmith' at Rushlake Green was likely referring to just the premises.
Sarah Standen, the wife of Elias Standen died in Salehurst 15 Mar 1828, age 46, of Iden, Kent.

2 Aaron age 52, married Mary Jane Barton (nee Burgess), age 35, 10 May 1873. John Standen was named as Aaron's father.

The date of the diary entry "John Oxley the new Blacksmith at Bodle Street" (Henry, M. 2024, p.98), on Wed 4th October 1815, was before Elias Standen snr. died in November 1815, and the removal of his son Elias to Goudhurst in 1816.

There were at least three blacksmith's premises in the area, in Churches Green, Warbleton, Rushlake Green and Bodle Street. John Oxley, and later, John Standen, were based at Bodle Street.

John Oxley 'the new blacksmith' later became an innkeeper at the Horse and Groom in Rushlake Green with his wife, John Oxley of Falmer m. Philadelphia Akehurst, 5th Jun 1814, Lewes.
John and Richard Oxley, two of John and Philadelphia's sons, were also blacksmiths.

1851 census, Elias Standen, age 70, b.1781, pauper (formerly blacksmith), b.Robertsbridge, Sussex.

1861 census, Elias Standen, age 79, b.1782, was a pauper, b. Salehurst, with Hannah his wife, age 60, b.1801, Staplehurst, Kent.

A (Aaron) Standen conveyed blacksmith premises to John Lade, WAT /1/8/12, 3 Feb 1888, ESBHRO at The Keep.

Fuller's Furnace Account Book, SAS-RF/15/3/22, ESBHRO at The Keep.

William Standen, b.1790, of Heathfield, blacksmith, widower, not able to work, rheumatic, admitted 29 Sep 1843, discharged at own wish, 30 Mar 1844, Hailsham Poor Law Union, (G/5/14/10/550, 29 Sep 1843, ESBHRO at The Keep).

William was admitted and discharged four times between 1847 to 1856, recorded as 'destitute' in 1854 and 'work found' in 1856. (G/5/14/10 series, ESBHRO at The Keep).

William Standen may have been the Master Standen Blacksmith in the July 1817 diary entry.

William's occupation as a blacksmith is recorded in the baptism record of his son William bp. 21 May 1815, Warbleton.

1851 census, John Standen and wife Elizabeth, Warbleton, includes Aaron Standen age 20, (a smith's apprentice).

1861 census, Aaron Standen named as John's son, b.1822, blacksmith, but his baptism record states he was William's son.

James Standen 1727, Maresfield, worked for Ambrose Galloway in the 1730s and named in the 'Journal of John Fuller'.
