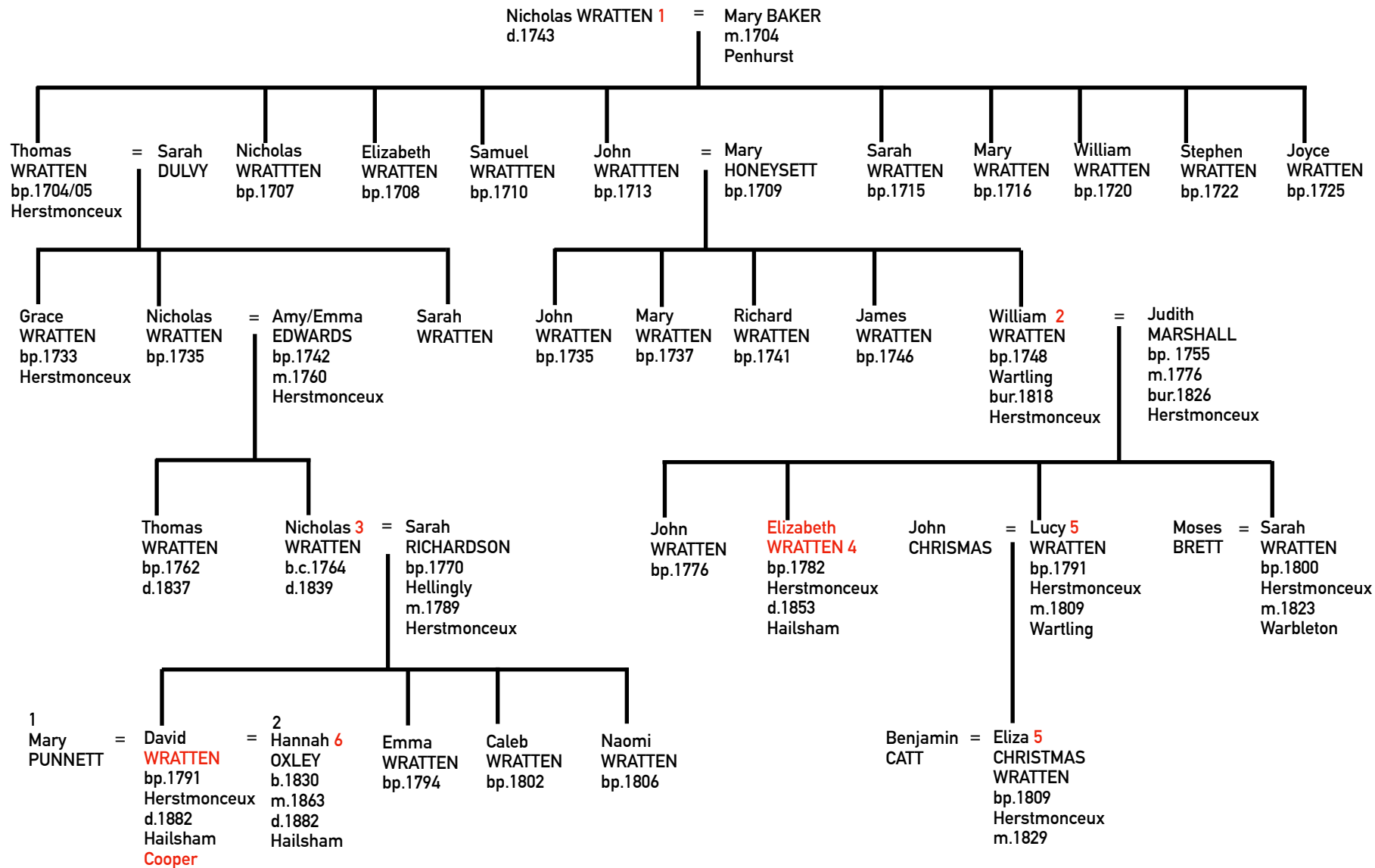

NOTES for the WRATTEN Family Tree Page 2 of 3

1 The marriage record for Nicholas and Mary used the variant PATTEN for Nicholas's surname, a transcript error or misheard at the time. Nicholas and Mary's children were baptised in Herstmonceux, Sussex.

2 Some sources suggest that William WRATTEN bp.1735/36 was the son of Nicholas WRATTEN bp.1707. Nicholas married Elizabeth CHEESEMEN in 1734 in Herstmonceux and there are four baptism records found for their children, William bp.1735/36, twins Elizabeth and Mary bp. and d.1738, and Samuel bp.1742, Wartling, with a possible burial in 1744. No further records for William have been found, except for a possible burial in 1772.

3 A baptism for Nicholas b.c.1764 was not found.

4 Elizabeth WRATTEN bp.1782 was one of eleven children. Elizabeth was living with her sister Sarah and brother in law Moses at Toll Farm, Warbleton, in 1841 and 1851 and she never married.

5 Lucy WRATTEN and her daughter Eliza Christmas WRATTEN were likely the 'sister and maid' with the named **Elizabeth WRATTEN** in the talley for Hoppers in the diary.

6 David WRATTEN's second wife Hannah OXLEY was the daughter of Samuel and Ann OXLEY (AXHILL). Hannah was one of twelve children.
