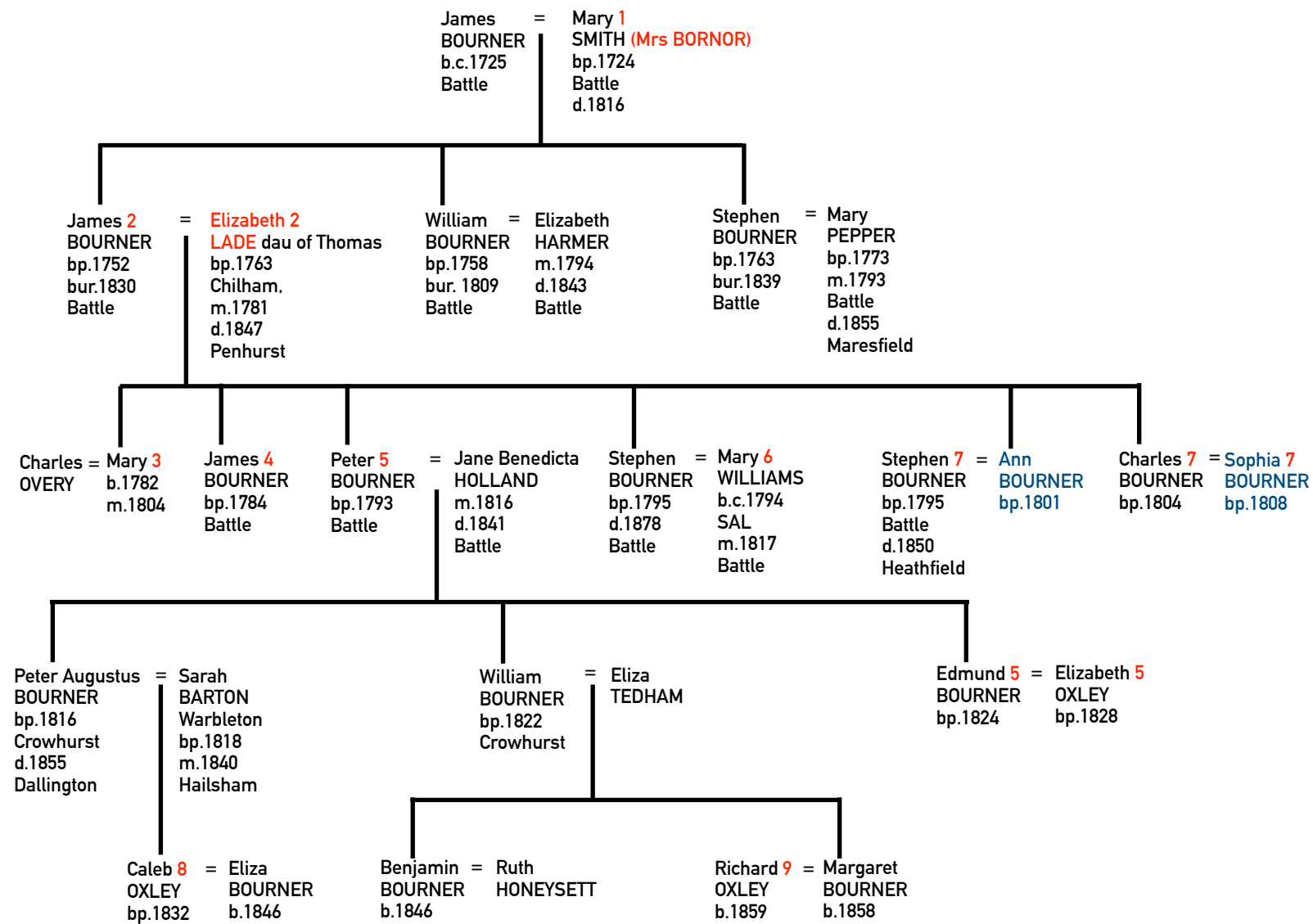

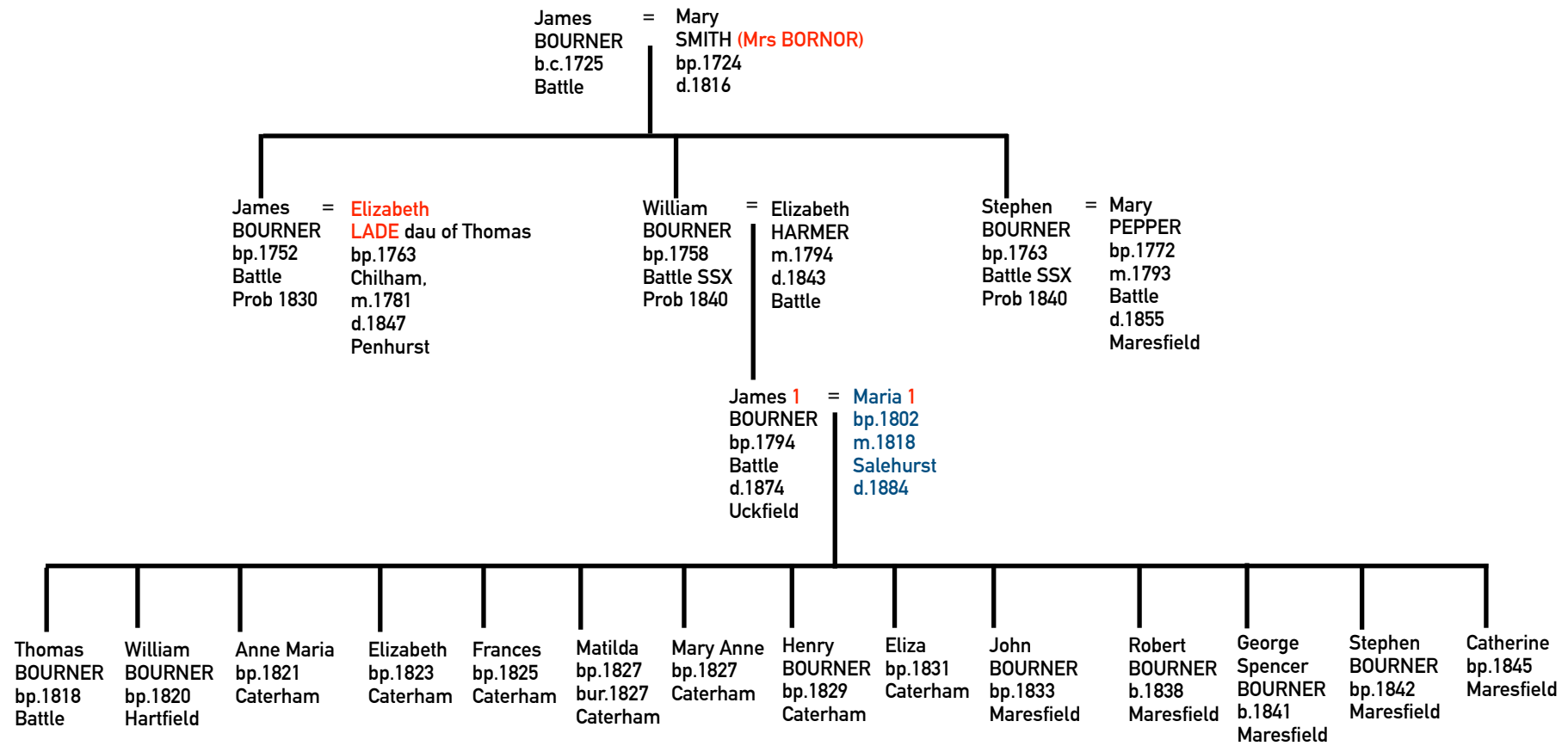

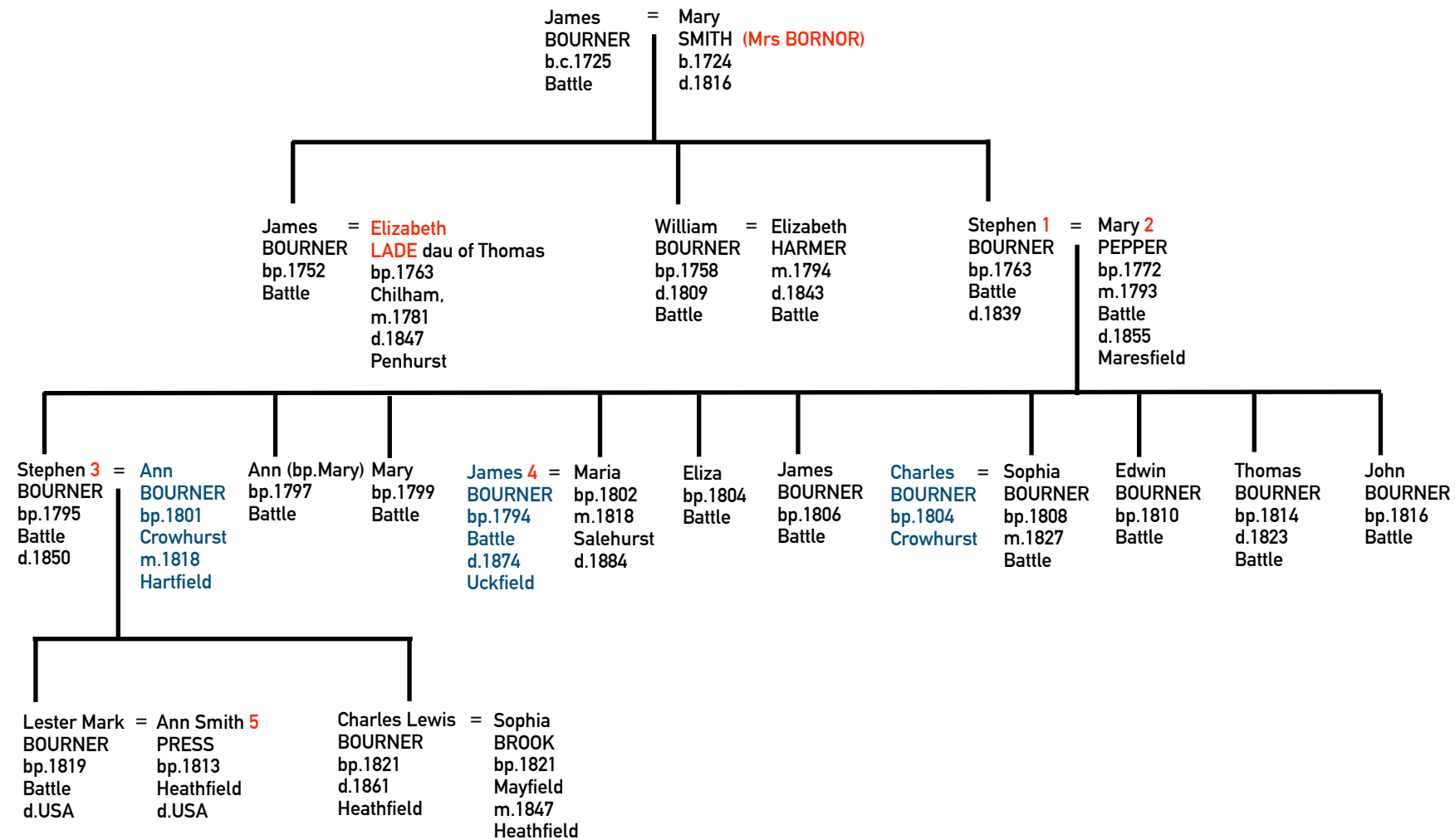
- 1 It is very likely that Mary was the **MRS BORNOR** (sic) named in the diary. 'Elizabeth is gone with **Elizabeth LADE** to **Mrs BORNOR's** near the Black Horse Battle' (Henry, M. 2024, pp.155-156). The Black Horse still exists and is in the Crowhurst area where Mary's grandchildren were baptised.
- 2 James BOURNER was named in the 1813 will of Elizabeth's father, Thomas LADE of Warbleton. Elizabeth's brother Thomas LADE married Elizabeth TRILL. It is likely that the **Elizabeth LADE** who visited **Mrs BORNOR** in 1816 was Elizabeth née TRILL.
- 3 Mary OVERY, widow was found in the 1851 census, b.c 1783. James BOURNER's 1830 will usefully gives the names of all the spouses of his daughters. Please find extended information for the Bournier family on <https://theweald.org>.
- 4 James BOURNER bp.1784 married Harriet WINBORN 14th Oct 1803. Their son Alfred b.1809 (baptised in 1820, Hartfield) was a pensioner of the Royal Navy. Alfred's navy records state his date of birth, 1st Jan 1809.
- 5 Peter married Jane Benedicta HOLLAND in 1816, Salehurst and his second wife Mary GALLOP in 1842, Battle. Mary left a will in 1888, confirmed in a 'Directories' transcription on Sussex Discovery. Peter's son Edmund married Elizabeth OXLEY bp.1828, daughter of John OXLEY, the 'new blacksmith' in 1815 (Henry, M.2024, p.98)
- 6 Stephen BOURNER married Mary WILLIAMS, 9th Aug 1817, Battle, Sussex. Mary's birthplace was enumerated as Uppington and Wellington, Shropshire in 1851 and 1861. Mary was baptised on 26th Mar 1789, Uppington, Shropshire dau. of Willm. Williams and Elizth. (née Bitterly). William was of Wellington and Elizabeth from Uppington where they married in 1785 by licence.
- 7 Stephen BOURNER son of Stephen and Mary married his first cousin Ann BOURNER daughter of James and Elizabeth. Sophia BOURNER daughter of Stephen and Mary, married her first cousin Charles BOURNER son of James and Elizabeth.
- 8 Caleb OXLEY was the son of Samuel OXLEY and Ann EXCEL (please see OXLEY Family Trees 1).
- 9 Benjamin's brother William's daughter Margaret BOURNER married Richard OXLEY the son of Richard and Jane OXLEY. Richard was the grandson of John OXLEY the 'new blacksmith' of Bodle Street Green.

Family Trees 2

1 Maria was the daughter of Stephen and Mary BOURNER (née PEPPER) and she married her first cousin James BOURNER son of William and Elizabeth BOURNER (née HARMER). James had the surname HARMER at baptism as he was born before his parents married.

Family Trees 3

1 Stephen BOURNER named all his children and the spouses of his daughters in his will of 1827.

2 Mary BOURNER née PEPPER was enumerated in the 1851 census with her grandson Charles BOURNER and his wife Sophia (née BROOK) at Dallington, East Sussex. The census information proved that Charles's grandfather Stephen BOURNER bp.1763 married a Mary. The marriage record was found following the correction of a transcription error.

Mary PEPPER married Stephen BOURNER, 13th Dec 1793, Battle, East Sussex.

Mary BOURNER was with her son in law Stephen BOURNER and her daughter Ann in the 1841 census, at Brans Hill, Battle.

Mary BOURNER died in 1855 (which notes Maresfield), and was likely at the home of her son James BOURNER and his wife Maria.

3 Stephen BOURNER bp.1795 took over the running of the Broad Oak Mill, Heathfield, after 1845. Stephen's death in 1850 was caused by a drowning accident near the mill. Stephen has a memorial stone at the Heathfield Chapel in Cade Street.

4 James BOURNER of Maresfield appears in a newspaper clip as having a particular skill in growing hops.

5 Ann Smith PRESS was the daughter of the Rev. John PRESS of Heathfield Chapel.
